

Question 42: (translated from French)

Two Aboriginal communities are respectively corporations domiciled within the territory of an RCM (Company A and Company B). Company A and Company B then form another company (Company C) in which Company A and Company B are shareholders. Does the Company C meets the definition of "local community" as defined by Hydro-Quebec?

Answer 42:

In this example for the Company C to meet the definition of local community, Companies A and B (shareholders of Company C) shall demonstrate that they each are a group of legally constituted natural persons held and controlled by members or shareholders mostly residing in the administrative region where the community wind energy project is located and provide adequate proof, as specified in section 1.3.1.2 of the call for tenders document.
