

**Question 55: (Translated from French)**

Can a bidder who has entered into a electricity supply contract with Hydro-Québec following a previous call for tenders and received a reserved land area for the lands in the domain of the State in order to set up wind turbines make it part of the area which has been allocated, but not used, to submit a community or Aboriginal project to this call for tenders, provided that generation is subject to separate metering and independent to that existing electricity supply contract?

**Answer 55:**

No. Any project submitted under the present call for tenders, regardless of whether or not it is located near a wind farm under contract with Hydro-Quebec, must be the subject of a new letter of intent issued by the government. Thus, each project must obtain a valid and recent letter of intent when the project is located wholly or in part on public lands.
