## Mitigation measures: Land users at work!

The Eastmain-1-A/Sarcelle/Rupert project is almost over. As construction of the Eastmain-1-A and Sarcelle powerhouses draws near completion, tallymen are stepping up their efforts to mitigate the impacts of the project on their traplines. Seeding banks, planting trees, putting up navigation signs, building portages, relocating affected camps, blazing ATV trails and roads . . . There's no doubt about it, the tallymen will be busy all summer long.

## Marking channels in the diversion bays

In June, tallymen from Mistissini and Nemaska put up some 300 signs in the diversion bays to help everyone learn to use and get around the new environment.

## Seeding the Rivière Rupert and worksites

Aerial and hydraulic seeding of the Rupert's banks and worksites including sand pits, quarries and borrow pits was done in July by specialized firms. Nine tallyman and their crews will mechanically seed another 53 ha. Work began in early July and should be finished by mid-August.
