
120-KV GRAND-BRÛLÉ—SAINT-SAUVEUR SUPPLY LINE PROJECT

HIGHLIGHTS

MEETING 6 – REGIONAL TECHNICAL COMMITTEE

- The regional technical committee (RTC) met on June 5, 2014.
- During the roundtable discussion, the representative from the municipality of Saint-Adolphe-d'Howard explained the various initiatives undertaken by the municipality and its advisory committee and their request that the project be submitted to the BAPE.
- The members of the RTC were given an overview of the technical aspects discussed at the technical sub-committee meeting on June 2. The municipality of Saint-Adolphe-d'Howard wants to submit an additional power supply scenario. Hydro-Québec stated that it is willing to work with the experts from Saint-Adolphe-d'Howard to study this scenario within the project schedule. The representatives from the municipality and Hydro-Québec agreed to discuss the matter further after the meeting.
- The RTC members were informed that the Table des préfets des Laurentides had adopted a resolution stating that the Table supports the MRC of Pays-d'en-Haut and the municipality of Saint-Adolphe-d'Howard in their requests that public hearings be held for the 120-kV Grand-Brulé—Saint-Sauveur supply line project.
- Hydro-Québec indicated that it had issued a press release to reiterate the continuation of its consultation for the project and its intention to consult the public again in the fall of 2014, when the work of the RTC is completed.
- The RTC members expressed an interest in examining the issue of public consultation in the next steps of the project.
- The representative of the city of Barkmere suggested giving a short presentation of the BAPE process to the RTC members at the next meeting.
- The results of the environmental assessment on a regional level were presented by the environment sub-committee. The members will review this assessment and submit their comments to the moderator before the next RTC meeting.
- The presentation on tower models, given by Hydro-Québec at the April 24 RTC meeting, was distributed to the RTC members.
- In response to the concerns related to the sections of the route where an existing line would be replaced (variant A, in Val-David, Val-Morin and Sainte-Adèle), Hydro-Québec confirmed that one of the new types of towers being considered would allow the width of the existing right-of-way to be maintained by adjusting the height of the towers.

- The RTC members will submit their questions and/or suggestions to the moderator to set the objectives of the next meeting.
- The next regional technical committee meeting will be held on June 19.
